Our Services

Babies and Toddlers School-Aged

New Parent Packets

We provide packets of up-to-date information and resources to hospitals and local boards for new parents, in addition to providing baskets of goods to new babies with Down syndrome.

New Parent Mentorship

We connect new families with trained DSAGT parent mentors to help guide them and be a support system for their first year.

New Parent Breakfast

Our annual New Parent Breakfast provides a safe and welcoming space for new families to connect with their peers and get acquainted with DSAGT.

Music and Movement

A music and movement class for little ones with Down syndrome between the ages of 1 and 4.

Smart Start

Smart Start is a program designed for Kindergarten readiness.

School Outreach

DSAGT provides "Book Bundles" to schools throughout the DSAGT service area to promote Down syndrome awareness.

Little Learners Educational Program

Students will have the opportunity to work in small groups with peers at their same ability levels and each month, work on their **reading and early math skills** in addition to their **speech and fine motor skills**, while also taking into account their individual IEP goals. Meanwhile, our parents will have the chance to connect and learn how to better educate their students and advocate for them in the school system.

Teen & Young Adult

Society 21

Once a month our teens and adults get together for a fun experience in our community, whether that be putt-putt, dancing, volunteering or a craft!

OpenSpot Theatre

Participants work on teamwork, cooperation, belonging, work ethic, memory, leadership, and social skills while learning about the 3 pillars of theatre, singing, dancing and acting!

All parents are welcome to partake in our regular social groups whether they are a virtual online meeting or a night out to discuss all things parenting and Down syndrome

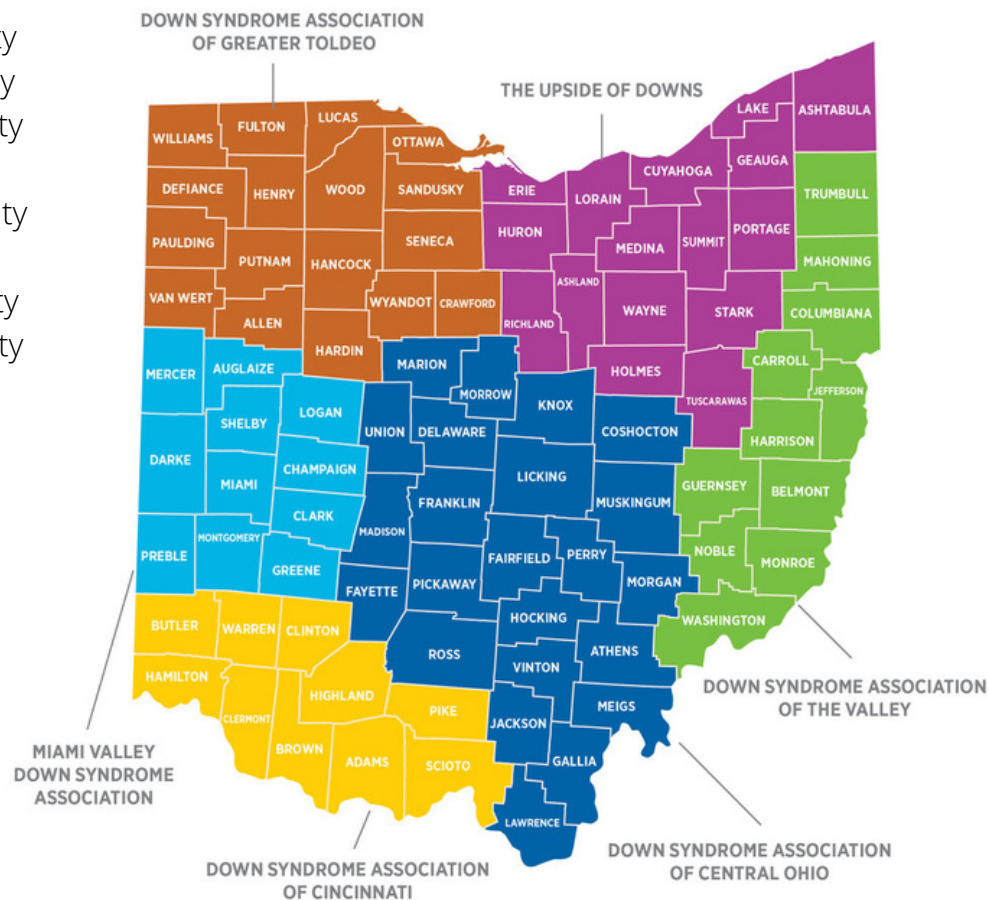

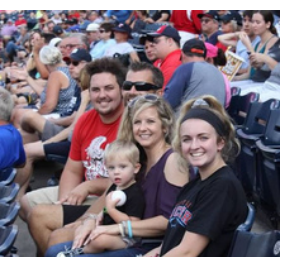

Our Events

The Down Syndrome Association of Greater Toledo is a 501(c)3 charitable organization and contributions are fully tax-deductible. Membership is free and open to anyone with an interest in Down syndrome.

DSAGT depends on donations and fundraisers to provide programs and services and meet operational costs. It is only through the generosity of many individuals and corporations that DSAGT is able to provide quality programs and services for individuals with Down syndrome and their families in the 17 counties we serve.



FAQ About Down Syndrome

- Down syndrome occurs when an individual has a full or partial extra copy of chromosome 21. This additional genetic material alters the course of development and causes the characteristics associated with Down syndrome.
- There are three types of Down syndrome: trisomy 21 (nondisjunction) accounts for 95% of cases, translocation accounts for about 4%, and mosaicism accounts for about 1%.
- Down syndrome is the most commonly occurring chromosomal condition. One in every 691 babies in the United States is born with Down syndrome – about 6,000 each year.
- There are approximately 400,000 people living with Down syndrome in the United States.
- Down syndrome occurs in people of all races and economic levels.
- The incidence of births of children with Down syndrome increases with the age of the mother. But due to higher fertility rates in younger women, 80% of children with Down syndrome are born to women under 35 years of age.
- People with Down syndrome have an increased risk for certain medical conditions such as congenital heart defects, respiratory and hearing problems, Alzheimer's disease, childhood leukemia and thyroid conditions. Many of these conditions are now treatable, so most people with Down syndrome lead healthy lives.
- A few of the common physical traits of Down syndrome are: low muscle tone, small stature, an upward slant to the eyes, and a single deep crease across the center of the palm. Every person with Down syndrome is a unique individual and may possess these characteristics to different degrees or not at all.
- Life expectancy for people with Down syndrome has increased dramatically in recent decades – from 25 in 1983 to 60 today.
- People with Down syndrome attend school, work, participate in decisions that affect them, have meaningful relationships, vote and contribute to society in many wonderful ways.
- All people with Down syndrome experience cognitive delays, but the effect is usually mild to moderate and is not indicative of the many strengths and talents that each individual possesses. Quality educational programs, a stimulating home environment, good health care and positive support from family, friends and the community enable people with Down syndrome to lead fulfilling and productive lives.

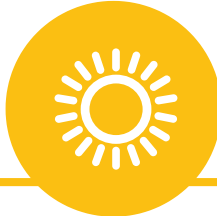

Prohibited Fundraising Practices

The policies of the DSAGT prohibit the following solicitation practices:

- Use of the DSAGT or Toledo Buddy Walk® name at the direct point-of-purchase sale of alcoholic or tobacco products.
- Use of The DSAGT or Toledo Buddy Walk® name in relation to any business activity that cannot guarantee full accounting for funds generated.
- Customer prospect campaigns conducted by independent contractors.
- Promotions to attract new patients to any form of medical treatment.
- Promotions related to the delivery of professional services.
- Online fundraising (must have prior written approval).



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ARE DONATIONS TAX DEDUCTIBLE?

» Your gift is tax deductible to the fullest extent allowed by the law. The Down Syndrome Association of Greater Toledo is a registered 501(c)3 organization. Our tax ID number is 34-1354191.

WHERE DO I GET DONATION FORMS?

» A donation form is enclosed in this packet, you may also print additional donation forms from the Team Captain's Corner on the Toledo Buddy Walk® website.

WHO SHOULD TOLEDO BUDDY WALK CHECKS BE MADE PAYABLE TO?

» For tax purposes, please make checks payable to the Down Syndrome Association of Greater Toledo or DSAGT. Checks should not be written to Buddy Walk teams, team captains or individual participants.

» Please ask donors to submit their corresponding donation forms with their checks so your team will be properly credited for your fundraising efforts. If this is not possible, please ask donors to indicate which walk team they are supporting and your name on the memo section of the check.

DO I HAVE TO SEND IN MY DONATIONS? CAN I BRING THEM WITH ME TO THE WALK? CAN I CONTINUE TO COLLECT DONATIONS AFTER THE WALK? WHAT IF MY DONORS DON'T WANT TO DONATE ONLINE? WHERE DO I SEND THE CHECKS?

» While you can always bring your donations to the walk, it is preferable that you mail them in as soon as you can to the address below. You may enter your donations on your Team Fundraising Page before sending them - once DSAGT receives your checks, we can approve your submissions. WHAT IF PEOPLE WANT TO GIVE ME CASH?

» It is safest and best for record-keeping that you convert all cash received to a check. If you are able, the safest option is to send a personal check covering the full amount, along with the corresponding donation forms to the Down Syndrome Association of Greater Toledo. We will be able to credit your friends and family for their generosity. If this is not possible, you can also always bring the cash donations and appropriate donation forms to the walk.

Event FAQs

WHAT IS THE REGISTRATION FEE?

» The registration fee is \$20/adult, \$10/child, both of which \$8 is tax deductible. Your registration fee includes an official commemorative Toledo Buddy Walk® t-shirt. Individuals with Down syndrome have free registration, but must still register.

SHOULD I REGISTER MY KIDS?

» Yes, please register everyone who will be attending (even toddlers in strollers). This helps us plan for the day of the event, plus only those who register, receive t-shirts.

I HAVE A FAMILY MEMBER WHO WANTS TO JOIN MY TEAM BUT MAY NOT BE ABLE TO ATTEND THE WALK. CAN THEY STILL JOIN MY TEAM?

» Yes, family members can still support you by joining your team and fundraise as a team member even if they are unable to attend.

WHAT IS THE CUT-OFF TO JOIN A TEAM?

» You can register online up to September 30th, before the event. Please have everyone register before September 1st to give us a good headcount so that we can plan for a better event. Registrants after the September 1st deadline may not receive a Toledo Buddy Walk shirt.

SOME OF MY FAMILY WOULD LIKE TO COME, BUT NOT WALK. DO THEY NEED TO REGISTER?

» We encourage every participant to register by September 1, 2023. A limited number of t-shirts will be available for purchase the day of the walk but we cannot guarantee your desired t-shirt size if you have not registered by September 1, 2023. Only those who register and pay the registration fee will receive a t-shirt.

IF I AM REGISTERED, DO I NEED TO DO ANYTHING ELSE TO BE PRE-REGISTERED?

» No, if you are already registered online, you are all set.

IS IT BETTER TO REGISTER ONLINE OR REGISTER THE MORNING OF THE WALK?

» There are many advantages to registering before the walk, for example: knowing how many people to expect will help us plan for a better event for everyone. DSAGT, event sponsors and vendors order all items based on how many people we have pre-registered for the walk. Plus, registering before the walk will alleviate registration lines at the event and you will be able to enjoy the event from the moment you get there. Each individual and team that registers will receive a webpage within the Toledo Buddy Walk website. This will give friends and family a place to go where they can donate directly to you online. You can also customize this page with a photo and special message.
